What is Appliance testing?

To inspect, test & tag, computers, leads, heaters, tools, etc, for safety and to protect against electric shock and fire.

Why is this important?

Many dangerous, hidden faults can only be discovered by specific electrical checks and tests.

There is no way to know that any electrical appliance is safe to use without testing by a qualified technician.

Is this compulsory for all businesses? **Yes.**

Management and staff are personally liable for safety testing under **Electrical Regulation 69 and 76 (3)** and **OSH** Regulations viewable at: www.3760.co.nz/legislation.htm

An electrical accident on your premises could cost someone's life, and you may be fined up to \$500,000 with two years in imprisonment under Section 49 and 50 of the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.

Other entities such as ACC MOE ISO MOH and others also require strict compliance with these regulations.

What is AS/NZS 3760?

This is the standard that specifies what tests are required under the Regulations for safety.

AS / NZS 3760 Foreword:

"In-service testing is necessary for the safety of persons using the equipment and for the proper discharge of the obligations of employers & employees as listed in legislation covering occupational health & safety matters. This standard specifies in-service safety inspection and testing protocols and criteria that satisfy these obligations, and provides a cost-effective approach to safety without jeopardizing personal safety or involving excessive equipment downtime."

2. Immediately refer any dangerous appliances to you for repair and place them where you require,

4. Provide a report and recommendations on the overall general safety of your appliances,
5. Provide appliance safety certificates as proof of your compliance with OSH regulations, to display at your reception and staffroom and to show any OSH inspector or auditor.

This is the minimum requirement for your safety compliance.

How often?

Any new or untagged appliance
Building sites and hire equipment
Factories, work areas and cleaning equipment
Schools and all other areas not mentioned
Residential areas of hotels, motels and rest homes
Some office and protected appliances

Maximum interval between tests

before use in any work place
3 monthly
6 monthly
1 yearly
2 yearly
5 yearly otherwise 1 yearly
